Founder: David Ben-Gurion

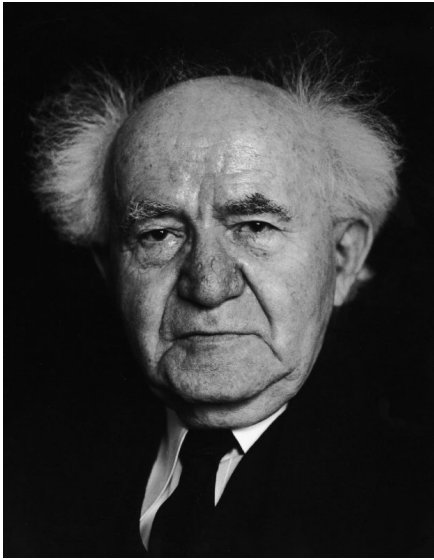
